



IA SCHOOL FOR CHILDREN WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES INCREASES SECURITY

THE CHANGE

- Brivo provides full system visibility across the campus and valuable peace of mind
- Laradon no longer relies on janitorial staff to manually lock and unlock doors and gates
- Doors in 15 buildings and three gates are all managed from one interface
- Multiple administrators can manage any number of records and credentials through one interface
- The system monitors all arrivals and departures and can be used as a backup timekeeping system
- Staff can manage the system remotely, which is critical given all the Colorado snow days

THE CHALLENGE

Laradon offers 12 different programs to more than 600 children and adults and needed fullproof security for its eight-acre campus in Denver.

- Established in the 1940s, Laradon had a lock-and-key system for access control and constraints of older buildings
- Laradon also had several gates for van access that would need to be managed from the same interface to save time
- A security system was needed that wouldn't require a lot of extra expense and hassle for deploying and managing

THE CHOICE

"We were dramatically affected by the Columbine tragedy. We tightened up security with badges and mandatory check-in, among other measures. After a shooting at a school 30 minutes away, we were really impacted by our potential vulnerability. We had to do more."
